Lemon Marketing Lab	Grades 3-5	June 8-12, 8am-12pm	\$320
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Introduce your student to the world of marketing this summer with Main Street Scholars! We will explore advertising strategies, create posters with Canva, develop budgeting skills, and host a lemonade stand at the end of the week. Students will learn social skills and practice grocery shopping in the community as they gain valuable 21st century knowledge in a kid-friendly environment. Students are sure to have a SWEET time with their peers this week!

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Calling all students preparing for a summer job! Students will create mini-resumes and advertisement posters to promote their skills. We will assist students in potential networking opportunities and guide them in scheduling interviews for positions based on their abilities, interests, and needs. Students will also take part in volunteer opportunities, budgeting lessons, mock interviews, presentation skills, and simple scheduling exercises to get them ready for a summer of opportunity! Students will explore all sorts of sewing projects and crafts this week, including making their own stuffed animals, learning mending skills, creating a sit-upon, embroidering a tote bag, and more!
